Please begin thinking about how you can help or what can you donate?


- Do you have access to a special place or garden that members would enjoy visiting and seeing?

Welcome to a new Hort year at the garden club!

Roxanne Wiley and I were fortunate to attend the Shirley Meneice conference in Denver in September.

Most of the events were held at the Denver Botanical Gardens, which is a large, beautifully maintained series of gardens. It seemed that the entire garden was in full bloom, with lush borders along every pathway. Three quarters of the clubs were represented with over 250 women in attendance. We heard several excellent speakers, including Dr. Cary Fowler, American agriculturalist, global advocate of crop diversity and conservation, who was instrumental in establishing the seed vault in Norway (Kim Bishop's provisional talk). Another well-known garden designer, Lauren Springer, whose topic was "Designing Naturalistic Plantings for Beauty, and Adaptability, and Creatures".

We attended several lectures, including organic gardening, the history of botanical prints (the Denver Botanical Garden has an extensive certificate program on botanical drawing) and practical permaculture. We spent a morning with other members of zone XII and enjoyed exchanging Hort





program ideas. The most popular program was our own bulb lasagna, other clubs were excited to try it out.

We spent most of a day at Chatfield farm, which is an extension of the botanical garden. It includes a large vegetable and flower garden (all of which are for sale to the public) a beautiful amphitheater for concerts, a butterfly house, prairie and lavender beds.

In other Hort news, our first provisional talk of the year will be October 7th and will feature a Provisional talk by Betsy Larson, entitled "The Masque of the Blue Garden". Please plan to attend to show your support for our newest members. Also, bring something for the first Hort Share of the season!



Want to sign-up to receive GCA publication?

1. Log into the GCA website and go to the READ, WATCH, SHOP tab and select publications.
