I'm looking forward to our first ever virtual Fall Picnic September 17th with everyone!



Ingredients

5 tablespoons prepared pesto	2-1/2 cups thinly sliced yellow summer squash
1 tablespoon lemon juice	1-3/4 cups thinly sliced mini cucumbers
2 teaspoons grated lemon zest	3/4 cup fresh peas
1-1/2 teaspoons Dijon mustard	1/2 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
1/4 teaspoon garlic salt	1/4 cup thinly sliced green onions
1/4 teaspoon pepper	5 thick-sliced bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

Directions



In a bowl, whisk together the first 6 ingredients until blended. In another bowl, combine squash, cucumbers, peas, Parmesan and green onions. Pour dressing over salad; toss to coat. Top with bacon to serve.
