
## Floral Design

The Floral Design Committee has had a busy fall! We started out with our November meeting where we had a workshop on leaf manipulation. Each attendee was given a set of leaves and learned how to create 5 basic designs using Gail Emmons book <u>Leaf Manipulation</u> as a guide. We called it a "speed workshop", given that we only had 45 minutes for the whole meeting.

In early December, we sponsored the **Provisionals** for a workshop at the Sunset Club. The purpose of the session was to review what is in a typical Floral Design tool kit, how to condition flowers, to think through a design, and to create it. The session ended with Marilee Ahalt discussing the judging program and how the arrangements would be judged at our Holiday Luncheon. We also put together two different designs so that the Provisionals could see a variety of interpretations of the same theme, "Fire and Ice". Many thanks to Marilee Ahalt for helping with the workshop.

I hope you enjoyed all the Provisional arrangements which are highlighted in this newsletter, and many thanks to Helen Blair and Joanne Rosen for providing two additional arrangements at the last minute!
