Dean Norton, our guest speaker for the October 17, 2024 General Meeting

Dean is the Director of Horticulture for Historic Mount Vernon. He leads the restoration effort of principal gardens and overall landscape of the vast Mount Vernon estate. He is a renowned authority on 18th century gardening history and practices, and is a favorite ambassador for Mount Vernon. Dean has received awards for conservation from the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), the American Horticultural Society, and the Garden Club of America including their prestigious Elizabeth Craig Warner Proctor National Medal. He is an honorary member of the Garden Club of Virginia , the Garden Club of Providence and was recently awarded an honorary doctorate from Washington College. Dean serves on several historic property boards and lectures both nationally and internationally. Most recently, he was chosen by Presidential Appointment to serve on the Committee of the Preservation of the White House.

The Provisional tenure is now one year. The procedure is:

- Proposer fills out, submits application and letter of recommendation
- Seconder submits letter of recommendation
- Reference #1 provides contact information on application
- Reference #2 provides contact information on application



Our application form is available on our website under Members Home/Forms <u>SGC Membership Proposal Form select here</u> you can download it, enter the information, save and submit it electronically to me, <u>Cathmueller@gmail.com</u>, OR you can print and fill it out with a pen then mail it to me along with the two letters of recommendation.


